CURRENT EVENTS

ROCK HILL ROAD ZONING ORDINANCE PASSES UNANIMOUSLY! (WARD 3)

On January 16, the Board of Commissioners unanimously approved an ordinance which removed an outdated exception from the zoning on Rock Hill Rd. By removing the exception, the ordinance terminated a decade old apartment project for 332 units in (4) 4-story buildings at 131/151 Rock Hill Rd. I am very excited that this ordinance passed unanimously but I do not want to overstate the vote's impact. The property owner or a future property owner can submit new plans, although the developer would be required to dedicate the first floor of each building to commercial use. Additional long-term zoning work is needed on Rock Hill Rd so that the area can be developed to better benefit the existing Rock Hill Rd occupants and community.

THE BALA EGYPTIAN THEATRE WILL BE PROTECTED AS A CLASS 1 HISTORIC RESOURCE (WARD 9) Also on Jan. 16, the Board of Commissioners granted class 1 historic status to the Bala Egyptian Theatre on Bala Ave. This is the highest degree of historic protection which the Township can provide. The owner will now need permission from the Board of Commissioners in the event the owner wishes to demolish/significantly alter the property. The property is privately owned and the Township cannot compel the property owner to develop or use it.

A new **BELMONT HILLS SIGN** was installed this January on Mary Watersford Rd. The old sign was badly damaged and the cost of a replacement sign was estimated at nearly \$2,500. The Township was having difficulty budgeting for the replacement. A Belmont Hills firefighter and resident stepped up and generously created an amazing replacement sign at no cost. There is a corresponding sign on Jefferson St which was temporarily removed so that the resident would have a model from which to work. Both signs are now out for the public to view. The old sign was allegedly destroyed twice by youth hockey players who used it for target practice with their sticks. Please take better care of this sign!

THE NEW PUBLIC MIDDLE SCHOOL

The School District will hold a **public meeting** at **8 p.m.** on **Jan. 28, 2019** at **315 E Montgomery Ave** regarding the middle school to be built in Villanova. The school will take approximately 1,200 students in grades 5-8, and will open in September, 2022. Students from Gladwyne and Penn Wynne Elementary Schools will feed into it. The School District has ended its pursuit of properties on Spring Mill Rd which were considered for fields. We have seen trailers on the Bala Cynwyd MS track for the past two years (below), and this new school will provide relief from overcrowding. However, the cost of the new school is substantial; the estimated budget is **\$120 million**.



BELMONT HILLS RESIDENTIAL ZONING Historically, Belmont Hills has been zoned as R6A/R5. This LDR4 Zoning led to development which the LM Building & Planning Dept described as a "hodgepodge." Under the new zoning code, Min. Lot Area (sq. ft.) 7.500 which the Township plans to enact on July 31, 2019, most Units/ Acre residential portions of Belmont Hills will be designated as 5.81 "Low Density Residential 4" or "LDR4." The proposed LDR4 Min. Lot Width (ft.) 60 standards are listed to the right. LDR4 is designed to create a single family district, which will make future development less dense. The idea is to create a more cohesive neighborhood Max. Lot Coverage (%) to improve the quality of life for the average resident and Bulk/Coverage improve the parking and traffic situation over time. Below in 45% purple are the portions of Belmont Hills and College Park Max. Impervious (%) which are proposed for LDR4. Max. Height (ft.) 35 ft/ 2 stories Belmont Hills Min. Front Setback (ft.) 25 Min. Side Setback (ft.) 10 College **Park** 25 Min. Rear Setback (ft.)

As shown above, much of **College Park** will also be zoned LDR4, which is consistent with College Park's prior zoning. If you have questions, a regional civic association event for the new zoning in **Belmont Hills** and **Bala Cynwyd** will occur at 7 p.m. on March 25, 2019 at the Township building (75 E. Lancaster Ave).

WELSH VALLEY PARKING RESTRICTIONS (WARDS 2 AND 3)

There is an ongoing parking issue near Welsh Valley MS covering the following locations:

- 1200 and 1300 blocks of Hagys Ford Rd (adjacent to Welsh Valley Middle School)where signs indicate "No Stopping or Standing" or similar language. Cars also park directly in front of accessible sidewalk ramps at pedestrian crossings.
- 1300 block of Flat Rock Rd (between Hagys Ford and Sprague)- parking on both sides of the street during school and athletic events impedes traffic and is a pedestrian risk.

This parking issue is in Wards 2 and 3. Ward 2 Commissioner Josh Grimes and I are working with the Lower Merion Police Department to enforce the parking restrictions and make the area safer. **Please obey the parking signs or you may be cited.**

BELMONT HILLS LIBRARY

The Library is <u>OPEN</u> on Monday and Tuesday (10 a.m.-8 p.m.), Wednesday and Thursday (noon-8 p.m.), and Saturday (10 a.m.-5 p.m.). The library is closed on Friday and Sunday.
